1909-1910 - 1st Lieutenant, "A" Company; Certificate of Honor, awarded for having received no demerits. Was a football team substitute. YMCA Vice-President. President of the Literary Society.

There was no textual information available from his senior year, 1910-1911. But John was likely Captain of "A" Company, which was usual during this time period. He must have lost weight and trimmed up, though.
